Meeting Objective

- To inform the development partners and government institutions about the creation of "INTER-MINISTERIAL SECTORAL DEVELOPMENT COORDINATION COMMISSIONS" with government resolution no.43/2024 as result of last year TLDPM meeting;
- Strengthen sectoral coordination with the aim of establishing a clear, long term common results framework across all sectors, including accounting for development partners contributions.

Content of Resolution



- The economic and social development objectives proposed in the national strategic development plan, which contains the general framework with which all programs and projects supported by development partners must be aligned, as agreed in the 2011 Dili Development Pact;
- The IX Constitutional Government's vision in terms of development aid is based on constantly improving the framework, forecasting and adapting external aid to Timor-Leste development needs;
- The commitment of the Ministry of Finance is to improve and make more efficient the management of external development aid as well as its monitoring and impact assessment.

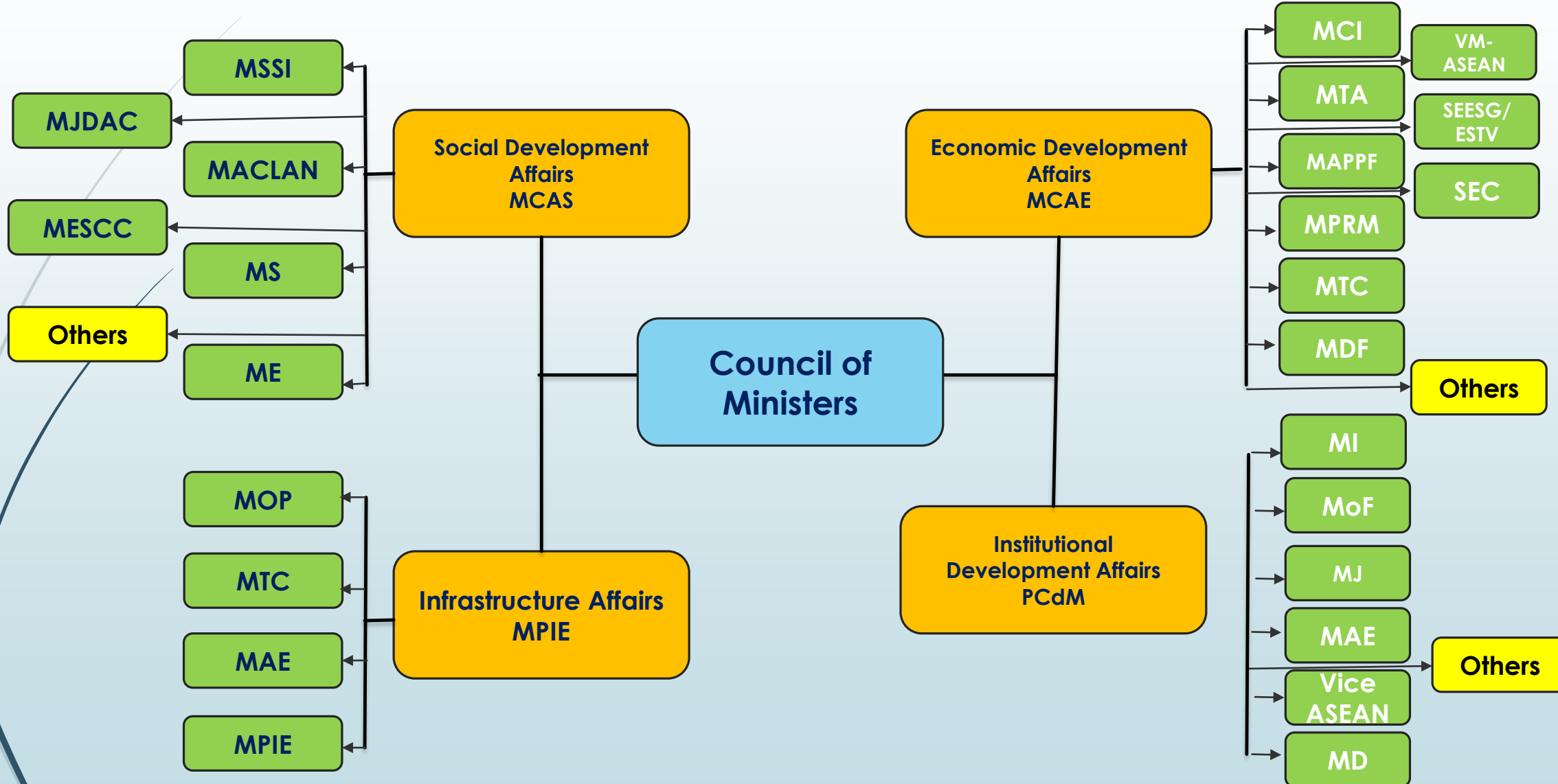

Competence and Responsibilities of Coordinating Ministries

- *Identify risks and challenges* as well as defining and prioritizing lines of action in the development sector under each responsibility, in an efficient and coordinated manner to ensure institutional alignment with development partners;
- *Provide the necessary institutional and governance mechanisms* so that the public administration and development partners to collaborate effectively in respecting the priorities of the Government's program;
- *Coordinate technical assistance* to support the Public Administration in the execution of development programs and agreements, and coordinate capacity building programs.
- *Analyze and support the development of strategies and the preparation of sectoral development plans* in collaboration with development partners and other tasks determine by law, and government regulation.



MoF and MNEC to provide technical and SECRETARIAL support

- **Ministry of Finance:**

- Negotiate agreements, analyze agreements
 - \$ 0,01 – 5 million
- Present to the Council of Ministers for approval;
 - Above \$5 million (need CoM Approval)
- Signatory to the agreements
- To receive regular updates on projects and portfolios

- **Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation:**

- Designing, implementing, coordinating, and evaluating foreign policy and international cooperation such as
 - Issue the Verbal Note for any cooperation in the diplomacy manner;
 - Sign the memorandum of Understanding, Such as G2G cooperation's, G2B ad vise verse
- Handles consular functions and promotes the interests of Timorese citizens abroad. Essentially, manages Timor-Leste's relationships with other countries and international organizations.



Conclusion

- The government resolutions are a way to maintain the coordination of public administration services as well with Timor-Leste's development partners
- Each Coordinating Ministry, cooperates with ministries under its responsibility and development partners to prepare technical documents related to their thematic portfolios, for instance project documents in collaboration with Development Partners
- Ministry of Finance is responsible for signing financing agreements and overall oversight of projects, particularly those financial implications.
- MNEC is responsible for designing, implementing, coordinating, and evaluating foreign policy and international cooperation.
