## **Preface**

## Part 1: Development Assistance in Combined Sources Budget 2018

As envisaged in Article 23.4 (b) of the Budget and Financial Management Law 13/2009 of 15 October 2009, the General Budget of the State of Timor-Leste must indicate funding by Development Partners (DPs). The Combined Sources Budget (CSB), which is the combination of general state budget and external assistance provided by DPs, is an important concept in Timor-Leste, as external assistance has substantially contributed to the development of Timor-Leste since its independence. Although the relative size of external assistance as a percentage has decreased as a result of the rapid expansion of the state budget in recent years, external assistance has consistently exceeded more than US\$150 million per year for the past 12 years.

External assistance indicated in the Budget Book No. 5 is an integral part of the CSB. In 2018, DPs are preparing to provide a total of US\$244.8 million, of which US\$181.73 million will be provided as grants and US\$61.6 million as concessional loans. Although the "External Assistance" concept includes both concessional loan and non-lending assistance, this Budget Book specifically focuses on non-lending (US\$181.7 million), which is equivalent to 12% of the 2018 Budget indicated in the Budget Book 1. The information on loan assistance is presented separately and explored in depth in the Infrastructure Fund in the Budget Book No. 6.

The information on non-lending assistance in this Budget Book contains the external assistance to be provided by multilateral and bilateral donors to the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste (RDTL). It includes the external assistance projects executed in direct collaboration with Government Ministries, as well as through Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs). In Chapter 5, all the external assistance projects to Timor-Leste are presented in accordance with the RDTL beneficiary institutions. It should be noted that the information presented in this Budget Book is derived from the Aid Transparency Portal (ATP), the government database to which DPs are responsible for providing data on all of their contributions, and through surveys provided to development partners. In order to assist the Government in preparing the General Budget of the State for 2018 and for more general aid coordination and effectiveness purposes, DPs are requested by the Ministry of Finance (MoF), GoTL, to update the ATP on a quarterly basis. All DP assistance data presented in this Budget Book was generated from a data set produced on the 25 July 2018 unless indicated otherwise.

## **Part 2: National Development Plans**

## 2.1 Strategic Development Plan 2011-2030

Timor-Leste's Strategic Development Plan 2011-2030 (SDP) was released in July 2011 and articulates Timor-Leste's vision of development for the next two decades. It is based on "Timor-Leste 2020: Our Nation Our Future," and is aligned with the United Nations' Millennium Development Goals (MDG). The SDP is an integrated package of strategic policies, which aims to transform Timor-Leste from a low income to upper middle-income country, with a healthy, well-educated and safe population by 2030.

The SDP covers four pillars: (1) Social Capital, (2) Infrastructure Development, (3) Economic Development, and (4) Institutional Frameworks. Each pillar sets out the areas and programs that need to be completed to achieve the collective vision of the SDP.

The <u>Social Capital</u> pillar focuses on building a healthy and well-educated society to address the social needs of Timor-Leste's people and promote human development. It covers five main areas: Education and Training, Health, Social Inclusion, Environment, and Culture and Heritage.

The <u>Infrastructure Development</u> pillar is to ensure that the nation has the core infrastructure needed to build a productive, sustainable, growing and connected nation. It covers six areas: Roads and Bridges, Water and Sanitation, Electricity, Seaports, Airports, and Telecommunications.

The <u>Economic Development</u> pillar aims to achieve a prosperous, modern economy and jobs for Timor-Leste's people. It covers five areas: Rural Development, Agriculture, Petroleum, Tourism, and Private Sector Investment.

The <u>Institutional Framework</u> pillar will help to provide an effective framework upon which the three other aspects of Timor-Leste's development will be built. It covers six areas: Security, Defence, Foreign Affairs, Justice, Public Sector Management and Good Governance, Strategic Planning and Investment/Economic Policy and Investment Agency.

With the signing of the Dili Development Pact at the 2011 Timor-Leste and Development Partners Meeting (TLDPM), the Government of Timor-Leste and its Development Partners came to an agreement that the SDP will be the overarching framework for all programs and projects to align with in the future.

## 2.2 Program of the VIII Constitutional Government

The Eighth Constitutional Government was sworn in on 22 June 2018.

The Government Program summarizes the main public policies to be adopted to reinforce and optimize the sectors of governance and their resources, shortening the path to transform the 2030 vision into reality and is based on five key sectors for the future of the country:

- In the sector of **social capital development**, the program presents a package of measures to maximize its potential, promoting inclusion, empowerment, qualification and health;
- In the sector of **Infrastructure development**, considered crucial for economic and social development, the Government intends to implement a quality infrastructural network, guaranteeing a good cost-benefit ratio and thus sustain productivity, job creation and development of the private sector;
- In the sector of **economic development**, the program presents measures for its modernization and diversification, boosting the productive sectors around three essential industries agriculture, tourism and oil with measures that stimulate creativity, innovation, entrepreneurship, enabling increased income opportunities, improved productivity, the ability to generate wealth and the creation of new markets;
- In the area of **Governance Consolidation**, the Government proposes to continue investing in strategic planning for a modern and diversified economy, with the goal of creating 60,000 new jobs per year, reducing poverty by 10% and average growth of the economy above 7%, increasing the contribution of the private and productive sectors, and making feasible the fiscal sustainability.
- In the area of **Good Governance and Anti-Corruption**, the program proposes to implement mechanisms for evaluation, performance and promotion of the principles of transparency, accountability, integrity and leadership, in order to increase confidence in governance and increase public sector competence and efficiency.

## 2.3 The New Deal for Engagement in Fragile States

The New Deal was presented at the 4th High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in Busan, Korea in 2011. Since then, more than 44 countries and organizations have endorsed the New Deal, including Timor-Leste. The New Deal guides development engagement in fragile countries through the promotion of country-owned and country-led pathways towards peace and resilience.

The New Deal was designed to accelerate the effectiveness of international engagement. It represents the first aid architecture in history for conflict-affected states and features three interconnected pillars; five Peacebuilding and Statebuilding goals (PSGs); and two guiding frameworks for implementation: FOCUS, a new way of engaging, and TRUST, a set of commitments by donors and recipient countries alike.

Peacebuilding and Statebuilding Goals (PSGs)

- 1. Inclusive Politics
- 2. Security
- 3. Justice
- 4. Economic Foundations
- 5. Revenue and Services

- F: Fragility Assessment

The New Deal framework will guide country-led planning, but each process will ultimately be defined by the unique context and challenges within an individual country. Each country -- local and national government actors together with Development Partners, civil society and the private sector -- will develop its own understanding of what the New Deal means, and set its own plans, targets and indicators.

## 2.3.1 Aid Management Effectiveness Policy

The Aid Management Effectiveness Policy (AMEP) – approved in 2017 - recognizes the importance of development assistance in supporting the nation's vision for development. Effective development assistance is based on sound working relationships between the Government and the Development Partners. The Government of Timor-Leste continuously seeks to ensure improvement in aid coordination and harmonization through collaboration, shared planning and objectives, and transparency. The AMEP provides guidelines and mechanism for planning, mobilization, implementation and monitoring of development assistance to ensure aid is aligned with government plans and priorities, and effective working relationships with development partners is maintained. Simultaneously, through the AMEP, development partners are encouraged to improve their alignment of assistance to government priorities, improve reporting and transparency of development assistance, and improve mechanisms for monitoring and achieving results, including innovative forms of aid that eliminate duplication and deliver aid more effectively (e.g. through budget support).

The implementation of AMEP is expected to result in a gradual decrease in off-budget project support; improve the reliability of development resources and increase the impact and efficiency of how development assistance is delivered. The overarching goal of the AMEP is based on international agreements to which Timor-Leste and Development Partners have subscribed to; including the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness, the Accra Agenda for Action, the OECD DAC Principles for Good International Engagement in Fragile States, the Addis Ababa Action Agenda and the New Deal.

## 2.4 Harmonization of the Sustainable Development Goals and the Strategic Development Plan

Timor-Leste is a Global Champion for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Government of Timor-Leste adopted the 2030 Agenda and Sustainable Development Goals two days before they were formally adopted by the United Nations at the General Assembly on 25 September 2015. On the global stage, the Government of Timor-Leste worked with the g7+ group of countries to successfully advocate for a Goal 16 on peace, justice and effective institutions.

In 2017, the Government of Timor-Leste started a process to develop a national roadmap to achieve the SDGs, as framed by the Agenda for 2030 and the SDG's aims and targets. The roadmap lists the plans and strategies that shaped the development expectation for the country, as well as the institutional systems, policies and structures established to allow and keep progress.

The Roadmap of Timor-Leste to implement SDGs is based upon the Strategic Development Plan 2011-2030, which sets out the series of aims and priorities for national development as described during national consultations to develop SDP and reflecting the expectations of Timorese citizens. SDP also lists the aims and targets, in line with the development and priorities of the country. This frames what the country needs to do to fulfil the SDGs.

Since 2015, the Government of Timor-Leste has been focusing in the short term on achieving the SDG Goal 2 'Nutrition and Food Security', Goal 3 'Health' Goal 4 'Education', Goal 6 'Water and Sanitation' and Goal 9 'Infrastructure'.




Figure 2.4.1 Timor-Leste SDG Roadmap

## **Part 3: Improved Development Partnership**

## 3.1 Development Partnership Management Unit

The DPMU is situated directly under the supervision of the Minister of Finance. The main responsibility of DPMU is to ensure the effective use of the external assistance provided by DPs to Timor-Leste, so as to guarantee coordination and harmonization in accordance with the development priorities set by the Government.

## 3.2 Aid Transparency Portal (ATP)

The ATP is a public database that is populated by Development Partners to track all grant assistance in Timor-Leste. The system allows all stakeholders, including government ministries and Development Partners to better understand the level of Official Development Assistance to Timor-Leste. Equipped with the ATP, the DPMU is able to further contribute to preparing quality State Budgets. The creation of the ATP allows for ease of access to current information on all DP assistance, by Government beneficiary institution, region, sector, SDP pillar, DP, providing information on planned and actual disbursements. The information published in this budget book is directly extracted from the ATP. All information in the ATP is directly entered into the system by the Development Partners themselves. ## Part 4: Trend of Development Assistance to Timor-Leste

## 4.1 General trend

The amount of ODA to Timor-Leste exceeded US\$200 million from 2011 to 2015 but has experienced a significant downward trend in non-lending beginning in 2015 that has led to the lowest levels of non-lending assistance in Timor-Leste, totalling US\$176.6 million in 2017. ODA as a percentage of the Combined Source Budget has become smaller, decreasing from 23.5% in 2010 to 12% in 2018 on a planned basis. In 2018, a planned total of US\$244.8 million will be provided to Timor-Leste. This includes US\$181.7 million in grants and US\$61.6 million in loans. The graph below highlights trends in non-lending support from development partners. This year, donor's planned disbursements are scheduled to exceed those from the previous two years.


Actual Disbursements

Forecasted funding more than one year in advance is typically unreliable for several reasons, most notably due to the fact that many donors operate on single year budgets. The dramatic decline in funding shown in the future years above is based on data collected at the project level, thus it does not include donor's funding that has been secured yet not committed towards specific projects. For example, the Millennium Challenge Corporation's future contributions are not included in these figures even though they are likely to contribute significantly towards the donor funding landscape.

## 4.2 Development partners in Timor-Leste

In 2018 Timor-Leste is scheduled to receive funding from ten bilateral sources and 14 multilateral sources. The five donor groups that have reported the highest levels of planned funding in 2018 are as follows: Government of Australia (\$61.7 million; 34 percent of total), Japan, including Government of Japan and JICA (\$24.2 million; 13 percent of total), Portugal, including funding from Camoes (\$16.1 million; 9 percent of total), the EU (\$11.8 million; 6 percent of total), and Germany (\$9.2 million; 5 percent of total). ## 4.3 Alignment to the Strategic Development Plan

As mentioned above, the SDP 2011-2030 and the Government Program are the overarching frameworks for all programs and projects to align with. The planned disbursement of DPs to each pillar and sub-pillar of the SDP in 2018 is indicated in the table below. It should be noted that the table simply shows the amount of external assistance in each SDP category; it does not mean that all projects are strictly aligned to only one sub-pillar.

Among the four pillars, *Social Capital* will be the largest recipient of aid, approximately \$83.8 million, or 46.1% of total planned disbursements in 2018. 2018 will see a continuation of Development Partner support to the Health and Education sub-pillars, accounting for a combined total of over 30 percent of all planned disbursements in the year. The third largest recipient of Development Partner support is the Agriculture SDP sub-pillar. All three of these areas are aligned with the first phase of the SDP/SDG Roadmap.

## 4.4 Aid Type

This year, the DPMU took additional steps to gather more useful information for and from our stakeholders. The tables presented in the following sections categorizes disbursements in the form of grants, technical assistance and unspecified. Grants were defined as *products and/or services necessary for the construction of facilities, provision of equipment; program support; or budget support.* Technical Assistance was defined as *funds to provide for education and training; payments to cover consultants, advisors or teachers, include the cost of associated equipment.* Finally, unspecified is included in cases where development partners did not provide the DPMU with the requested information.


Development Partners were asked to estimate the percentage of funds that were used for grants and TA for each project. Based on the number provided, the DPMU produced the calculations included below. We hope to continue to improve upon the quality and usefulness of the information generated in our reports.

According to the data collected, donors assistance directly supporting Government agencies will account for 91.3% of all donor assistance in 2018. 48.3% of that assistance will be funding technical assistance activities, 41.7% grant activities, and the remaining 10.1% of funds were not identified by donors. ## 5.1 External Assistance by RDTL Beneficiary Institutions\* (non-lending)

These tables provide Government beneficiary institutions with details necessary to create budgets that are more informed by the contributions of development partners. Please note that only Ministries that are scheduled to receive support from 2018-2021. Actual disbursements for 2018 were not included below.

## 5.1.01 Ministry of Public Works, Transport, and Communications (MoPWTC)

The Ministry of Public Works, Transport and Communication is scheduled to receive a total of US\$ 36.3 million in 2018, the largest development assistance to line ministry recipient relative to other line ministries. Support to the Ministry of Public Works, Transport and Communication in the form of grants accounts for 82.1% of the total planned 2018, or US\$ 29.8 million in absolute terms, while 17.7% of the total 2018 planned disbursement will be provided through technical assistance (US\$ 6.4 million). The largest of these grant projects are executed by JICA and ILO, including "The Project for Urgent relocation of Ferry Terminal in Dili Port", with funds of US\$ 9.7 million planned for 2018; "The Project for Construction of Upriver Comoro Bridge", with funds of US\$ 4.9 million for planned 2018, and "ILO's Australia-funded "Roads for Development (R4D) Phase II" with funds of US\$ 5.2 million planned for 2018.

## 5.1.02 Ministry of Health (MOH)

The Ministry of Health is scheduled to receive the second highest level of support from donors in 2018, with a total value of US\$ 30.0million in 2018. 31.3% (US\$ 9.4 million) of the total planned funds for the Ministry of Health in 2018 are from the Australian Government for the "Australia – Timor-Leste Partnership for Human Development" project. Fund disbursements to the Ministry of Health in the form of grants account for 45.8% of the total planned 2018, or US\$ 13.7 million in absolute terms, while 31.0% of total 2018 planned disbursement is technical assistance (US\$ 9.3 million). Many of the project funds disbursed to the Ministry of Health comprise split proportion of grant and technical assistance elements.

Funds disbursement to the Ministry of Education in the form of grants account for 36.5% of the total planned disbursement in 2018, or US\$ 10.6 million in absolute terms, while 61.1% of total planned disbursement is technical assistance (US\$ 17.7 million). Portugal's assistance will account for 48% of all donor support towards the Ministry of Education, while Australian support will account for approximately 29.6%, meanwhile, New Zealand's Aid Programme will account for roughly 11% of all planned disbursements in 2018.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries is scheduled to receive support with a total value of US\$ 24.2 million in 2018. Out of the total planned disbursements, 44.9% of the total planned disbursements account for grant projects, or US\$ 10.9 million in absolute terms, while 50.3% of the total planned disbursement is technical assistance (US\$ 12.2 million). The grant project with the largest planned disbursement for 2018 is funded by the

World Bank, namely "Timor-Leste: Sustainable Agriculture Productivity Improvement Project" with US\$4.0 million planned for 2018. The "Partnership for Sustainable Agroforestry Project," funded by the European Union and Germany is the technical assistance project with the largest planned disbursement for 2018, accounting for US\$ 4.7 million.
